Anthropic -- An unreleased model made unexpected progress on the Riemann hypothesis, one of mathematics' longest-standing unsolved problems. While it didn't solve the conjecture, the model's ability to generate novel mathematical reasoning at this level suggests frontier LLMs are crossing from pattern-matching into genuine mathematical exploration. If this holds up under scrutiny, it points toward AI-assisted breakthroughs in theoretical domains that have resisted human effort for over a century. [TechCrunch](#)

Microsoft Research -- Introduced CARE-X, a radiology vision-language model framework that goes beyond report generation to combine calibrated reasoning, reward-aligned learning, and tool-augmented measurement for chest X-ray interpretation. This tackles a real clinical gap: prior radiology VLMs could describe images but couldn't reliably produce quantitative measurements or calibrated confidence.
