Google DeepMind introduced SL2T (sign-language-to-text), a model powering new sign language features for Deaf and hard-of-hearing users. This represents a qualitative jump beyond prior sign language recognition work, which largely handled isolated signs or limited vocabularies at lab scale, by delivering a production-ready translation pipeline. The accessibility angle is immediate, but the underlying video-to-text architecture could inform broader research in continuous gesture, activity recognition, and human-robot interaction where interpreting body motion in real time matters.
