--- SECTION 2: NOTABLE DEVELOPMENTS ---

NVIDIA released **Cosmos-H-Dreams**, a real-time generative simulation framework aimed at surgical robotics. The key claim is bringing generative simulation to a real-time regime, which previously was too slow for interactive robotic control loops. If it holds up, this could matter well beyond surgery -- any domain requiring high-fidelity, real-time simulation for embodied AI training or closed-loop control (field robotics, autonomous manipulation) could benefit. Watch for validation against real surgical workflows and whether the simulation fidelity is sufficient for policy transfer to physical robots. [Hugging Face Blog](#)
